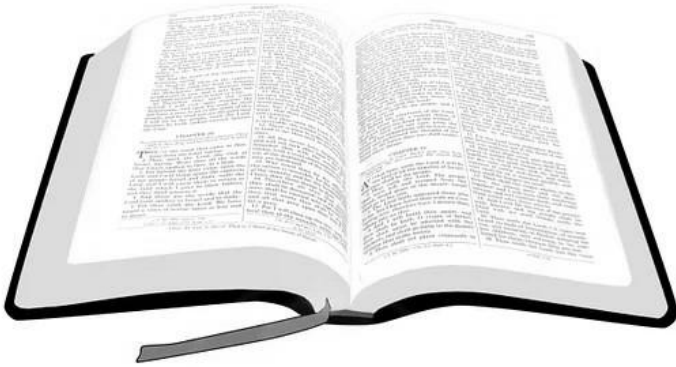

STUDY OF A FLYING SPARROW

Giovanni da Udine
(1487-1564)

"[In Matthew 10:26] Jesus is urging his followers not to have a *phobeo* (do not fear) of men, which is destructive, but a reverential awe or fear of God, which is constructive. Prov. 29:25 addresses the fear syndrome: 'The fear of man brings a snare, but whoever trusts in the name of the Lord shall be secure', 'Perfect love casts our fear.' Being filled with God's Spirit will cause you to become fearless. (2 Tim. 1:7)" (*The Spirit Filled Study Bible*)

"The poor could purchase sparrows, probably the cheapest mean in the market, *penny calculation* (*An assarion*, worth less than an hour's wage for the average worker, a roughly equivalent calculation... Jewish teachers often reasoned by means of 'How much more' arguments. If God watches over sparrows (v. 29), he certainly watches over his children." (*Cultural Backgrounds Study Bible*)

"Giovanni da Udine was an Italian painter and architect born in Udine... [and was] a student and assistant of Raphael... One of his well-known discoveries is the art of Stucco, that Giovanni was the "new-founder" of after antiquity: occasioned by the discovery of the *Domus Aurea*, Nero's residence near the Colosseum: in the first year of the 16th century Raphael and his students went down '*Mons Coelius*' into tunnels that were formed to explore that area. With candles and torches they explored the caves and looked at the walls onto which were painted little heavy colored figures that were named "*grottesche* (*pl.*), *grottesca* (*s.*)" because in the darkness, these images seemed like paint in ancient caves that in Italian was -and is- said like above. There was a strange 'pictorial relief' onto which some of this 'grottesche' were realized: it was Roman stucco, an important technique that the ancient Romans utilized to reproduce a marble effect, real marble was already too expensive by that time even for the Emperor... it was the most famous residence of the Roman Empire."
